## Foreword

---

All entries in this booklet have made application for certification. However, certification status will not be granted until field inspection and laboratory tests are complete.



The Illinois Crop Improvement Association certifies seed of all crops for varietal purity and identity only. Information concerning germination and mechanical purity, such as percent inert matter and percent weed seed, must comply with state and federal seed laws. Proper labeling of seed with this information is the responsibility of the seed producer or seed dealer.

Please remember that for varieties where plant variety protection has been applied for, or has been granted, the proper statement to this effect must be attached to each container.

## IL Crop Procedures

---

1. Contact IL Crop before planting for an application to grow Foundation, Registered, Certified or Quality Assurance seed.
2. For Foundation seed production, plant Breeder or Foundation seed. For Registered seed production, plant Foundation seed. For Certified seed production, plant Foundation or Registered seed. For Quality Assurance seed, plant quality seed of known varietal purity and identity.
3. Save tags to establish proof of seed origin and class (all crops) and submit a variety description/ statement of origin at the time of application.
4. Select clean, weed-free ground. Check the IL Crop regulations to see if the field meets all of the requirements, such as isolation from other varieties and crop history of the land from the previous year.
5. Clean planting equipment before planting.
6. Submit the proper application and fee.
7. Rogue the field for other crops, varieties and weeds.
8. Make sure the field inspection has been completed by an IL Crop inspector before harvesting.
9. Clean the combine, transporting equipment and storage facilities to remove crop and weed seeds before harvesting.
10. Submit an uncleaned and/or cleaned sample as required (See Procedures Manual) to the IL Crop laboratory for analysis.
11. Contact IL Crop with tag orders after receiving laboratory reports.
12. The certification, for all classes, is considered “completed” following compliance with all final lab requirements and attachment of tags to bags. QA tag use is optional, but final lab requirements apply.

---

## Plant Variety Protection

---

Protected varieties are marked with the following symbol:



The developer of a new distinct variety may obtain protection (essentially a patent) for that variety if he or she chooses to do so, provided the variety meets the requirements of the Plant Variety Protection Act (PVPA).

The developer of the variety may sell either certified or non-certified seed of the variety (U.S. protected variety statements below).

The developer may choose to utilize the provisions of the Title V of the Federal Seed Act in which the variety may only be sold by variety name only as a class of certified seed.

The PVPA 1994 insures that the variety may not be sold farmer-to-farmer without permission from the developer.

If the developer of a protected variety has reason to believe that anyone is infringing on his rights, he or she may resort to civil action.

It is the responsibility of the seller to inform the buyer if the variety is protected. Each container of seed sold must be labeled with a tag indicating the type of protection for which the owner has applied.

Failure to print proper PVPA statements violates the intellectual property rights of those who protected the variety.

For the time when a PVP application is submitted until the PVP office has approved it, the following statement is used:

**Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. variety protection applied for. PVPA 1994.**

---

### Bulk Transfer - Uncleaned Seed

---

A bulk transfer is necessary when unconditioned seed is transferred from the seed producer to another for the purpose of cleaning, bagging or selling. A bulk transfer form must be filled out at the time of transfer. A \$40 fee will be assessed to the seed producer for each bulk transfer. Refer to the Illinois Crop Improvement Handbook of Seed Certification for complete details regarding membership and Approved Conditioner Sampler requirements.

---

### Bulk Sale - Cleaned Certified Seed

---

The bulk sale of Certified class seed applies only to wheat, barley, oats, rice and soybeans. When a producer wishes to sell bulk, cleaned, Certified seed to another to use for planting stock, it is considered a bulk sale of Certified seed. The seed may be transferred once prior to movement to the ultimate consumer. It is the responsibility of the seedsman and retailer to maintain varietal purity if a transfer is made. The original bulk sale certificate holder is to provide photocopies to accompany any further sale from the intermediary to the farmer. A bulk retail sales certificate must be filled out for each lot of seed sold. These certificates are available from the IL Crop office. Eleven cents per bushel will be assessed on each bulk sale.

---

## Limited Generation

---

There are only four classes of certified seed recognized in the limited generation program.

1. **Breeder's Seed**—which may produce Foundation seed.
2. **Foundation Seed**—which may produce Registered and Certified seed.  
*Note: Some varieties do not have a Registered class of seed.*
3. **Registered Seed**—which may produce Certified seed.
4. **Certified Seed**—which cannot be used to produce more Certified seed.

The Certified class of seed is not eligible to produce another crop of Certified seed. A certified seed producer, to stay in business, should purchase Foundation or Registered seed to remain a certified seed producer.

Varieties released in 1963, and later, are included in the limited generation program.

It should be understood by everyone that this limited generation program system of seed certification does not apply to the old established varieties released prior to 1963 such as Monon and Pawnee wheats. Certified seed of these old standard varieties, released before 1963, may be re-certified from Certified seed as long as they comply with both the field and laboratory standards, or until they are replaced by a new variety. In other words, varieties released prior to 1963 are not included in limited generation. Varieties released in 1963, and later, are included in the limited generation program.

---

## Approved Conditioner and Sampler Program

---

The objective of the Approved Conditioner and Sampler Program is to set a uniform minimum standard for conducting seed conditioning operations necessary to maintain the genetic purity of seed and other products throughout the harvesting, storage, handling and conditioning processes as part of an authorized IL Crop authentication program. Approval is granted on an annual basis and may be granted for conditioning, sampling, closing and sealing, labeling and bulk transfer for all crops, specific crops, specified conditioning activities or sampling only.

**25R56**



**25R56** is a soft red winter wheat developed by Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Inc. 25R56 is primarily intended for grain production and has shown good adaptation to the northern soft wheat regions based on tests conducted in Arkansas, Kentucky, Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Michigan, Maryland and Ontario, Canada. The coleoptile color is white and the juvenile growth habit is semi-erect. Leaf color at booting is green. The flag leaf is erect, twisted and has a waxy bloom. Auricle color is white and anther color is yellow. Spikes of 25R56 are apically awnletted, mid-dense, tapering in shape and nodding at maturity. 25R56 has shown excellent resistance to stripe rust in the mid-south U.S. region. It also has very good resistance to leaf rust in the northern Corn Belt. It is moderately resistant to the complex of organisms that incite leaf blights including Septoria tritici blotch, Stagnospora nordorum leaf blotch and tan spot. 25R56 has intermediate resistance to the prevalent races of powdery mildew, wheat spindle mosaic virus and soilborne mosaic virus. 25R56 has shown resistance to Hessian fly biotype L in tests conducted by the USDA-ARS Crop Production and Pest Control Research Unit at Purdue University and is postulated to have the H9H10 genes for Hessian fly resistance. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation, Registered, and Certified. The PVPA statement for 25R56 is “Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. protected variety. PVPA 1994.”

**766**



**766** is a soft red winter wheat released by J.G. Limited, Inc. with maturity similar to Clark. Leaf color at booting is green with twisted flag leaves. It is medium short height with an allowance for 2 percent tall and is awnletted. 766 is resistant to powdery mildew and is moderately resistant to leaf rust, glume blotch, wheat spindle streak, barley yellow dwarf virus, and Septoria leaf spot. It has good winter hardiness, moderate straw strength and very good test weight. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation and Certified. The PVPA statement for 766 is "Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. protected variety. Seed of this variety is to be sold by variety name only as a class of certified seed. PVPA 1994."

## Bess\*

**Bess** is a soft red winter wheat variety bred and developed by the University of Missouri Agricultural Experiment Station. Bess is a white chaffed, apically awnletted variety with an average height of 38 to 40 inches and good straw strength. This variety is moderately early maturing averaging 1 to 2 days later than Ernie, 1 to 2 days earlier than Roane and 5 days earlier than Truman. It has good resistance against Fusarium head blight (scab). Bess is moderately resistant to stripe rust but is considered susceptible to both leaf rust and stem rust. It has intermediate field reaction to Septoria leaf blotch and is moderately resistant to soil-borne mosaic virus and moderately susceptible to wheat spindle streak virus and barley yellow dwarf virus. Bess is susceptible to all races of Hessian fly. Up to 1 percent variant described as

taller and shorter awned heads; taller tip awned lax heads; tall awnletted variants including those with light green heads and blue-green awnletted variants are allowed. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation and Certified. \*Plant variety protection to be applied for on this variety.

### Branson



**Branson** is a soft red winter wheat variety bred and developed by AgriPro Wheat. Branson is a medium height semi-dwarf variety with good straw strength. This variety is moderately resistant to Septoria leaf blotch, stripe rust and powdery mildew. Branson is intermediate resistant to soilborne mosaic virus and leaf rust. Juvenile growth habit is semi-erect with dark green plant color at the boot stage. Flag leaf at boot stage is erect and twisted. Anther color is yellow and head shape is strap, mid-dense and awnletted. Glumes are glabrous, narrow in width and long in length with oblique shoulders and obtuse beaks. Seed shape is ovate. Brush hairs are mid-long in length and occupy a large area of the seed tip. Seed cheeks are rounded and the crease depth is shallow and width is narrow. Up to 0.8 percent variant plants described as taller in height and/or awned may be encountered. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation, Registered and Certified. The PVP statement for Branson is "Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. protected variety. Seed of this variety is to be sold by variety name only as a class of certified seed. PVPA 1994."

## Cardinal

**Cardinal** is a soft red winter wheat variety released by the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center. Cardinal is an awnless variety with mid-season maturity. It matures about two days later than Caldwell. It is a moderately short cultivar with excellent straw strength and excellent winter hardiness. Cardinal is resistant to leaf rust and moderately resistant to powdery mildew. It carries good resistance to wheat spindle streak mosaic. Cardinal has dark green foliage and has white chaff at maturity. Cardinal has an allowance of 0.3 percent plants which are awned, red or white chaffed or awnless, red chaffed. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation, Registered and Certified.

### Cooper



**Cooper** is a soft red winter wheat variety developed by AgriPro Wheat. It is a medium height, medium maturity and very good test weight wheat. In both intensive and standard production, Cooper has shown consistent yield and test weight in the double cropping region of the soft red production area. Cooper has shown intermediate or moderate susceptibility to the predominant diseases in this region. Juvenile growth habit is semi-erect with blue-green plant color at the boot stage. Flag leaf at boot stage is erect and twisted. Auricle anthocyanin and auricle hairs are present. Waxy bloom is present on the stem, flag leaf sheath and head. Anther color is yellow and head shape is strap, mid-dense and apically awnletted. Glumes are medium in width and short in length with oblique shoulders and obtuse beaks. Seed shape is ovate. Brush hairs are short in length. Seed cheeks are rounded and the crease depth is shallow and width is narrow. This variety may contain up to 1 percent variant plants. Approximately 80 percent of the variant plants were taller in height and approximately 20 percent of the variant plants were awned. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation, Registered and Certified. The PVPA statement for Cooper is “Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. protected variety. Seed of this variety is to be sold by variety name only as a class of certified seed. PVPA 1994.”

### Ernie



**Ernie** is an early maturing soft red winter wheat variety released by the Missouri Agricultural Experiment Station. Ernie is a white chaffed, apically awnletted wheat with midlong tapering spikes. It is a short cultivar with the same maturity as Clark and winter hardiness similar to Cardinal. Ernie has high test weight and very good milling and baking qualities. Ernie is moderately resistant to Septoria leaf blotch, powdery mildew and barley yellow dwarf virus. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation and Certified. The PVPA statement for Ernie is “Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. protected variety. Seed of this variety is to be sold by variety name only as a class of certified seed. PVPA 1994.”

### Kaskaskia



**Kaskaskia** is a soft red winter wheat released by the Illinois Agricultural Experiment Station. It heads several days earlier than Cardinal and is about the same height or slightly taller than Cardinal. Kaskaskia is bearded and has tan chaff at maturity. It has a distinctive appearance after heading because of the erect and twisted flag leaves. It is very winterhardy and is resistant to some races of leaf rust. Up to 0.5 percent variants may be found. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation and Certified. The PVPA statement for Kaskaskia is “Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. protected variety. Seed of this variety is to be sold by variety name only as a class of certified seed. PVPA 1994.”

## Pembroke

**Pembroke** is a soft red winter wheat variety developed by the Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station. Pembroke was released in 2007 for its grain yield, superior test weight and excellent adult plant resistance to powdery mildew. This variety has good resistance to stripe rust and moderate resistance to Fusarium head blight and speckled leaf blotch. Pembroke is susceptible to prevalent biotypes of Hessian fly and moderately susceptible to leaf rust. Milling and baking quality, as well as winter hardiness, is acceptable. Maturity of Pembroke wheat is mid-early, heading approximately 2 days later than Clark wheat. Straw strength and resistance are excellent. Pembroke has compact spikes and fully awned heads with white chaff. Kernel size is intermediate. Allowed variants up to 2 percent may include taller plants with same head type and maturity, taller plants with later maturity, dark green color, awnletted heads, bronze chaff, or any combination thereof. Pembroke wheat is licensed by the Kentucky Small Grain Growers' Association and is produced and marketed by its members. Recognized classes are Breeder, Foundation, Registered, Certified and Quality Assurance (QA).

### Roane



**Roane** is a full-season, awnleted, soft red winter wheat released by the Virginia Agricultural Experiment Station. Plant color is blue green at booting. Flag leaf at booting stage is recurved and twisted. Plant height is 1 inch taller than Coker 9803. Winter hardiness is similar to Madison. Roane is resistant to the prevalent field populations of powdery mildew, susceptible to stem rust, intermediately resistant to soilborne mosaic, wheat spindle streak mosaic viruses, and to leaf and glume blotch. Roane possesses a moderate level of resistance to scab. It is resistant to Hessian fly biotypes GP, B, C, and E. It is susceptible to bio- types D and L. Recognized classes of seed are Foundation and Certified. The PVPA statement for Roane is “Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. protected variety. Seed of this variety is to be sold by variety name only as a class of certified seed. PVPA 1994.”

### W1377



**W1377** is a soft red winter wheat variety bred and developed by Syngenta Seeds, Inc. and its legacy companies under the Agripro Brand for grain production. W1377 is medium height wheat. This variety has shown tolerance to the stripe rust races, intermediate reaction to leaf rust field races and intermediate reaction to Fusarium head scab. W1377 has shown susceptibility to powdery mildew and resistance to Biotypes B and E of Hessian fly. Juvenile growth habit is semi-erect with green plant color at

the boot stage. Flag leaf at boot stage is erect and twisted. Waxy bloom is present on the head, stem and flag leaf sheath. Anther color is yellow and head shape is tapering and apically awnletted. Glumes are glabrous, medium in width and mid-long in length with square shoulders and obtuse beaks. Seed shape is ovate. Brush hairs are mid-long in length and occupy a large area of the seed tip. Seed cheeks are rounded and the crease depth is shallow and width is narrow. Up to 1.0 percent variant plants described as taller in height and /or awned may be encountered. Recognized of seed are Foundation, Registered and Certified. The PVP statement for W1377 is “Unauthorized propagation prohibited. U.S. protected variety. Seed of this variety is to be sold by variety name only as class of certified seed. PVPA 1994.”
